

Home learning KS2 –shopping 2 (Transactions, money and jobs)

Our topic this half term is shopping Please find below some activities that you can do with your child at home linked to the topic. There are different suggestions so please choose the ones that you think your child will enjoy. We would love to hear how they get on with these activities.

Using money

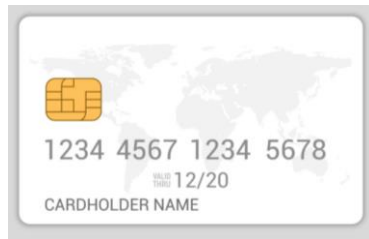


In a role play shop, or even when your child has a snack or a meal, you could ask them to pay for it – they could just give a coin or they could count out 1p coins or they could find different coins

Encourage your child to listen to coins dropping into water or into a tin so they make a noise – can they find where they are or turn to the sound?

Ask your child to find coins in a tray of water, flour or hidden in playdough. Be careful that they don't put the coins in their mouth

Going contactless



You could let your child pretend to pay by card for toys/snacks etc. Have 5 pictures of a contactless card and each time they use the card, take one away to show that paying for things by card has a cost

What we do at the shops



Encourage your child to wait for a turn – maybe they can line up behind another family member to wait to get something they want, to help learn about queuing in shops.

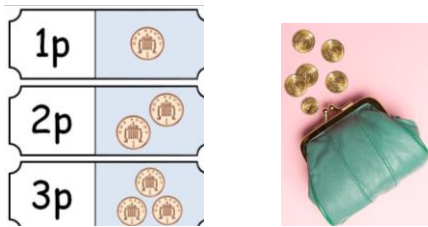
They could put their dolls/soft toys in a line and then your child can be the shopkeeper giving them something in turn

Doing jobs



Ask your child to help with jobs round the house- sorting/putting things in the recycling, tidying up, sweeping, putting washing in the machine etc. and each time they do that they get a coin. Then at the end of the day they give you the coins to get a reward. If the end of the day is too long then they get a coin for one job and then give it to you for a reward e.g. time on the iPad.

How much is it?



Your child can count out 1p coins for different amounts. You could ask them to count out 2 coins to be the same as a 2p or 5 coins to be the same as a 5p

Make price labels – your child can write the label or choose which toy to put the label on in a role play shop or on their snack or at a meal

Set up a role play shop with price labels and ask your child which toy costs 1p, 5p etc.

Have a wallet or tin for money and ask your child to open it to get a given number of coins out and then shut it again, practising their fine motor skills
