The successful candidate will deliver exceptional education, providing a personalised and inclusive curriculum to pupils aged 3-11 years with a range of severe learning difficulties and complex needs, many with an additional diagnosis of Autism. They will embody the school's commitment to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children.

Teaching and Learning Responsibilities

- Curriculum Planning & Delivery- Plan and deliver engaging, personalised lessons tailored to individual pupil needs, in line with our core curriculum values of Engagement, Opportunity, Creativity and Fun.
- Differentiation- Adapt teaching strategies, resources, and learning activities to ensure all pupils, regardless of ability, can access and engage with the curriculum effectively. Provide appropriate support to meet individual learning needs.
- Formative & Summative Assessment- Regularly assess pupil progress using Tapestry online journals to inform next steps for learning.
- Education and Health Care plan (EHCP) Tracking- Monitor and evaluate progress against EHCP outcomes ensuring interventions are effective and targets are met.

Classroom & Behaviour management

- Positive Behaviour Support- Implement behaviour support plans and use positive strategies to promote engagement and self-regulation.
